

Humble ISD honors Dr. Bonnie Longnion for 25 years of Board service, including providing state leadership as President of the Texas Association of School Boards



“You were the one who helped me understand how education works.”

“I want to personally thank you for what you’ve done for me as a trustee and as a person.”

“You’ve been a mentor. You’ve been a friend.”

“If I had 10,000 tongues, I couldn’t say thank you enough.”

These were among the tributes made to Dr. Bonnie Longnion at June 11, 2013, school board meeting for her 25 years of service on the Humble ISD Board of Trustees. Dr. Longnion served on the Humble ISD School Board from 1988 through 2013, including four times as School Board President (1993, 1999, 2006, 2001). She also provided statewide recognition for Humble ISD by being elected President of the Texas Association of Schools Boards for 2003.

“Thank you - those words seem, at least to me, very inadequate,” Humble ISD Superintendent Dr. Guy Sconzo said when beginning the evening’s tributes to Dr. Longnion. “You have given your heart to our school district and did that tirelessly on behalf of children.”

School board members individually thanked Dr. Longnion, and former Board members and friends were in attendance for the presentation.

Dr. Longnion, a retired college administrator from the Lone Star College system, provided leadership as the district grew from serving 17,500 students in 1998 to more than 37,000 students today. There were 12 elementary schools, four middle schools and two high schools when she joined the Board in 1988. In the 2013-2014 school year, Humble ISD will operate 27 elementary schools, 8 middle schools and six high schools.
