## Guidance Curriculum

“Help students develop their full educational potential, including the student’s interests and career objectives.” (ASCA, 2018) At OFE, classroom guidance lessons are based on the Great 8 Skills for Daily Living.

## Responsive Services

“Intervene on behalf of any student whose immediate personal concerns or problems put the student’s continued educational, career, personal, and social development at-risk.” (ASCA, 2018)

## Individual Planning

“Guide the student as the student plans, monitors, and manages the student’s own educational, career, personal, and social development.” (ASCA, 2018) In addition, we help with transitional to different grade levels and through one on one meetings with every student enrolled on the campus.

## System Support

“Support the effort of teachers, staff, parents, and other members of the community in promoting the educational, career, personal, and social development of students.” (ASCA, 2018) This can include referrals to community resources, such as counseling services and food distribution.
