Supplies needed

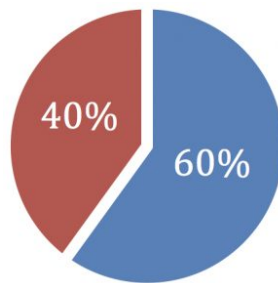
- Mobile Device / Computer
- Charger for mobile device
- Vocabulary list and notes
- Folder/ binder + writing utensil

These will be needed for class EVERY DAY. Without them you will be unable to participate fully, which will affect your grade.

Grades are determined as follows:

40% = formative

- Quizzes
- Class warm-ups & exit activities
 - “Entradas” & “Salidas”
- Homework
- In-class assignments



60% = summative

- Unit projects
- Compositions
- Tests

Make up work: In general you will have until the end of class to turn in your work. Work not completed in this time frame will receive a zero with the opportunity to earn partial credit for work submitted late. It is the **student's** responsibility to see the teacher for make-up work (or request it via email).

- Keep in mind that work that was assigned is due at the end of class.
- If you are absent for a quiz or test please communicate with your teacher. You will be required to make up the quiz/test **the day you return..**
- If you do not make up a test or quiz within a week of your absence, you will not receive full credit.
- If you are absent, always communicate first.

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Retest:

You may not retest if your formative work is not complete.

Homework: Your work must be completed **by the end of class**. Incomplete and missing assignments will receive **NO CREDIT**.

Classroom Rules and Consequences:

Expectations for Class

ARRIVE ON TIME

- Greet the teacher in Spanish.

TARDY

- You are considered tardy if not in class before the bell.

COMPLETE WARMUP

- There will be a warmup to complete when you walk in class.
- Complete the warmup at the beginning of class

FIND A QUIET SPACE TO WORK

- Eliminate distraction.
- Sometimes we watch videos, make sure to **always bring** headphones / earbuds.

BE PREPARED

- Charged computer / phone.
- Complete your homework BEFORE CLASS BEGINS.

PARTICIPATION

- You should not be working on other things during class. You must pay attention!
- You can't learn if you don't practice.

BE RESPECTFUL

- Be kind and respectful with your classmates and me.

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Class Expectations:

Consequences (steps):

1. Warning/ redirection
2. Meeting/Conference with student
3. Parent Contact
4. Office Referral

SCHS Grading Policy

- Grades are weighted as follows:
Level Courses: 60% Summative, 40% Formative
All grades are an assessment of an academic skill, concept, or performance.
- Grades based on behaviors are reflected in conduct grades.
- Major or summative assessments are defined as tests, projects, etc.
- Minor or formative assessments are defined as quizzes, daily grades, homework, etc.
- There will be a minimum of 4 major summative assessments per nine weeks.
- The minimum number of grades is 2 grades per week.
- Grades cannot be doubled or tripled to meet minimum requirements.
- Grades are posted at least once a week and published to parents and students through eSchool.
- All assignments will be entered into the gradebook before the start of the week in which the assignment is assigned or communicated weekly via the teacher/parent contact source.
- Parents will be contacted when a student fails a class for the nine weeks.
- Grading Scale:
 - 90-100 A
 - 80-89 B
 - 70-79 C
 - 0 – 69 F

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Reassessment Policy

- A student has the opportunity to reassess a summative grade of less than 85 a maximum of once a grading period. The maximum grade on the reassessment will be an 85. Students must make corrections to the original summative test and complete all formative assignments to be eligible for reassessment. Reassessments must be offered within 1 calendar week of the date in which the original graded assessment was returned. Students must make arrangements to attend the re-teach and reassessment date set by the teacher if reassessment is done outside of school hours.
- Reassessment is not available for AP and Dual Credit classes.

** Students may not be able to reassess the last test of the 9 weeks if time does not permit.

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Late Work Policy

All Summer Creek High School teachers will utilize the following late work policy for all classes, regardless of level.

- Late daily work will be accepted up to 5 school days after the due date with a penalty of 20 points per day.
- The maximum penalty for a summative assignment completed within the 9 weeks is 30 points.
- Assignments turned in after the end of the school day are considered late.

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Online Work

I will assign some activities and assignments that can be completed electronically via a web-based application. Since these assignments can be assigned and made due at any time on any day, students must stay aware of deadlines. The teacher will communicate the deadlines in class, in writing, and electronically as appropriate. Students should make every effort to access the assignment via their own computer, phone, or library computer.

Late work policies and penalties do apply to online work.

Cheating/Plagiarism

Cheating on an assignment or test will result in zero being recorded for that assignment or test. In addition, cheating is considered a conduct violation and is subject to additional disciplinary measures as discussed in the Student Code of Conduct.

SCHS students found cheating or plagiarizing (cheating) will receive a minimum violation of 2 Saturday detentions and will be ineligible to exempt final exams.

The following guideline is used at Summer Creek to define and discipline for plagiarism. Additional information can be found at plagiarism.org

All of the following are considered plagiarism:

- turning in someone else's work as your own
- copying words or ideas from someone else without giving credit
- failing to put a quotation in quotation marks
- giving incorrect information about the source of a quotation
- changing words but copying the sentence structure of a source without giving credit
- copying so many words or ideas from a source that it makes up the majority of your work, whether you give credit or not
