

**Can all Career & Technical Education (CTE) courses be completed fully online?**

In alignment with TEA, some Career and Technical Education (CTE) classes require a portion of the course to be completed with an instructor on-campus. These courses require specialized equipment, direct supervision of hands-on activities, and/or specific materials and technology. Students choosing remote instruction will be required to come on campus to carry out specified assignments and activities that cannot be reasonably completed remotely.

**How much on-campus time will be required in designated On-Campus CTE courses?**

Frequency and amount of required on-campus instruction will vary by individual course requirements. CTE course instructors will provide students and parents a schedule of required on-campus activities. Prior to the start of school, On-Campus CTE course instructors will reach out to their parents and students to provide further details of on-campus activities and time requirements. This communication will continue throughout the semester as needed for the individual course. Please let your teacher know if you have extenuating circumstances. Some certifications are simply not possible without personal contact.

**At what time during the day will On-Campus CTE courses be held?**

This will vary by course and by campus. It will all be coordinated through the individual course instructor and communicated directly with the parents and students. These on-campus sessions may occur during or after the normal school day at the discretion of the campus.

**What if my student is unable to attend the on-campus component of the designated CTE course?**

Failure to attend required on-campus assignments could result in absences that may subject the student to the minimum attendance requirement for class credit. Families may choose different CTE or other elective courses that can be satisfied in a fully remote setting. If the student is unable to satisfy the on-campus required component, please contact their counselor as soon as possible for a schedule change.

**Will removing my student from a CTE class affect their graduation endorsement?**

**Will Humble ISD provide transportation for required CTE on-campus components?**
