

## Cell Phones/Electronic Devices

Cell phones and electronic devices, if brought to school, must be turned off and kept in the student's locker unless a teacher gives express permission to use a device in the classroom.

- **Inside the Classroom**

- If a student is using a cell phone/electronic device in class without the teacher's permission, the teacher will confiscate the device.
- Using a device in class without permission will be considered a **Possession of Telecommunications or Other Electronic Device** offense.
- The explanation of this offense can be found in the student handbook on page 9.
- The device will be sent to the AP Office.

- 1st Offense**

- The student will be given a warning and a parent will be notified.
    - The student will be responsible for picking up the device after school in the AP Office.

- 2nd Offense**

- The student will automatically receive a d-hall/detention and a parent will be notified.
    - The parent will be responsible for picking up the device after school in the AP Office.

- 3rd Offense**

- The student will automatically receive a Thursday/Saturday Class and a parent will be notified.
    - The parent will be responsible for picking up the device from school in the AP Office.

- **Outside the Classroom/But Inside the Building**

- 1st Offense**

- The device will be taken up by a staff member and taken to the AP office and a parent will be notified.
    - The student will be given a warning and will be responsible for picking up the device after school in the AP Office.

- 2nd Offense**

- The device will be taken up by a staff member and taken to the AP office and a parent will be notified.
    - The student will be given a d-hall/detention and the parent will be responsible for picking up the device after school in the AP Office.
