

Tiers of Intervention

Tier 3 Interventions: Specialized, intensive interventions. Tier 3 and receive intensified, comprehensive intervention in addition to their grade-level curriculum.

1) Teacher, Academic Coach, Counselor, Parent, SPED (IPR, RC OR designated times as Data Sources)

- Focused interventions
 - : ARC MAPS/ LL class for “high needs” 9th and 10th and 11th graders.
 - Will focus on Behavioral and Academic Needs.
 - Student progress to be monitored and measured
 - Intensive Support for TSI and Academics
 - Students to be identified based on RC S1
 - If class cannot make, students with academic needs will be met with -1X week in either LL or MAPS classes. Progress to be monitored.
 - TSI Support through mandatory TSI flex tutorials OR KIT Fridays.
- Summer School and Other Credit Recovery Opportunities
 - Identified via RC S1 and STAAR Results
 - Parent notes sent out
- TSI Prep classes
 - Flextime TSI Prep
 - 9th reading supported through interventionist
- Interventionist Pull-Outs
 - Reading Interventionist- Pull out
 - Identified through 8th grade STAAR scores <Met standard
 - Reading Lexile scores <1045

Tier 2 Interventions: Supplemental, intensive interventions, fluid. Support may need to increase to Tier 2 for students who are not making progress at Tier 1- this is typically 10%-15% of all students.

- 2) Teacher, Academic Coach, Counselor, Parent (IPR, RC OR designated times as Data Sources)
- 3) Teacher, Academic Coach, Counselor, Parent, SPED (IPR, RC OR designated times as Data Sources)

- Mandatory Flex Tutoring
 - Students identified based on facilitator need
- MAPS class Advising
 - Students Identified through 9 weeks IPRs/RCs
 - Advising through Maps to focus on Academics as well organizational skills.
- Interventionist Pull-Outs
 - Reading Interventionist- Pull out
 - Identified through 8th grade STAAR scores <Met standard
 - Reading Lexile scores <1045
 - Math Interventionist-Push in
- QSP Process
 - For Students that are historically unsuccessful
 - Students who are on grade level but have not passed TSI
- Mandatory KIT Days: Based on teacher requests.
 - TSI KIT-One per month
 - Academic KIT -One per month for remediation
- College Reading Prep Class (MAPS replacement)
- At-Risk Counselor follow ups

Tier 1 Interventions: All students in general education that receive interventions within a general educational setting. Teachers deliver high-quality, core class instruction that is aligned with state standards and in which 80% or more of the students are successful.

-Tiers and individual interventions to be monitored by teachers, concerns to be brought to supporting staff.
