

## Tener que + infinitive

- I. Used to express what a person is obligated to do, or has to do.
- II. Must have 2 verbs in the sentence.
- III. Tener is the verb that is conjugated, the other verb is in the infinitive form.
- IV. Formulas for writing sentences:

Subject + conjugated tener + que + infinitive + rest.

Subject + no + conjugated tener + que + infinitive + rest.

### Conjugation of tener (to have)

Yo tengo

Nosotros tenemos

Tú tienes

Usted tiene

Ustedes tienen

Él tiene

Ellos tienen

Ella tiene

Ellas tienen

Ex. Yo tengo que terminar mi tarea.  
I need to finish my homework.

Nosotros tenemos que pasar el examen.  
We need to pass the test.

Ellos tienen que escribir la tarea en español.  
They are obligated to write the homework in Spanish.
