If a student is absent, they will need to check the Algebra II website (through my website) for class assignments, notes and messages. You are expected to keep up with your notes and assignments via the website during your absence. The student is allotted one day for every absence to turn in any missed work. It is their responsibility to obtain and complete any missing assignments! **If a student is absent on a test day, they will be expected to take it the day they return during One Lunch.** If a student is absent on a review day, which is not considered a "Day of Instruction," they will still be expected to take the test when they return.



You are considered tardy if you are not in the room when the bell rings. If you are tardy, immediately go to the House Office for a pass, come in quietly, turn in your tardy pass, pick up supplies and take your seat.



During class time, each student is responsible for the TI-84 calculator that corresponds to the number given him or her by their teacher. If a calculator has been damaged prior to the start of class, you must notify the teacher immediately. You are not required to purchase a personal calculator, but you may find it useful as the year progresses. The TI-84 is what we will be using in class. If you own your own TI-84, you are welcome to bring it if you like (as long as it has your name on the calculator and cover). You will use a schooled owned calculator for all tests.
